#### Issue For Consideration

Whether material facts for recrimination petition under Section 97 RP Act, 1951 be incorporated in the written statement in election petition by way of amendment?

#### Headnotes

**Code of Civil Procedure - Order VI Rule 17 - Amendment of Written statement - Scope of Representation of the People Act - Limitation period - Applicant filed amendment of written statement in election petition - Proposed amendments already on record of the recrimination petition - Allegedly omitted by Bonafide mistake - No new pleas to be introduced - No prejudice shall be cause to any parties - Determination thereof:**

**Held:** The Court held that the contents of the proposed amendment are not necessary for determining the controversy in the election petition as the proposed amendment are against the election petitioner which has been already included in the recrimination petition and not against the returned candidate. Procedural flexibility under CPC cannot override mandatory provisions of Representation of the People Act. Plea for recrimination petition against the election petitioner cannot be incorporated in the written statement by way of amendment in the election petition against the returned candidate. Application for amendment dismissed with cost. [Paras 18, 19 & 20]
